Importing Livestock from Idaho or Wyoming to New York

The importation (except for slaughter) of any livestock into New York requires an approved Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) completed by a category 2 accredited veterinarian. A CVI must include:

- The name and address of both the origin (consignor) and destination (consignee) of each animal, date of issue, and dates and results of any qualifying tests
- A statement that the animals have been inspected by an accredited veterinarian and that the animals show no signs of disease (except where noted)
- Each animal must be identified by a unique ear tag, registration or premises tattoo or microchip; all man-made identification must be recorded
- A copy of the completed certificate of veterinary inspection must be forwarded to the department of agriculture of the state of origin prior to shipment.

Cattle Testing Requirements

(Note: includes all bovidae: antelopes, cattle, bison, buffaloes, gazelles, etc.)

- **Anaplasmosis** – Cattle six months of age or older must test negative to a U.S.D.A. approved anaplasmosis test within 30 days prior to importation.
- **Brucellosis** - Cattle 18 months of age or older must be classified negative by a U.S.D.A. approved brucellosis test conducted within 30 days prior to importation.

Horse Testing requirements

(Note: includes horses, donkeys, asses, mules and zebras)

- **Equine Infectious Anemia**- Horses six months of age or older must test negative to an U.S.D.A. approved E.I.A. test conducted at an approved laboratory within 12 months of importation. The C.V.I. should include the name and address of the testing laboratory

Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas and Alpacas- no testing required
